

Celebrating Easter

How do you celebrate Easter? In the last few years when we have been out walking we have noticed that people are decorating for Easter more. We will stop to admire a tree hung with delicately painted Easter eggs. The egg from which the chick emerges is a symbol of new life, and in the West, Easter falls in the spring when signs of new life in nature are all around us — and which of us isn't longing for that after the dark and difficult days of winter.

For Christians, the celebration of Easter is all about the new life of resurrection. What had seemed a tragic story, ending in the ignominy of Jesus's execution on a Roman cross, turns around to become a story of the ultimate overcoming of life and love. For Christians, this means our faith is grounded in hope – not false optimism, but hope.



It also means that Easter is a very special time of celebration. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week – the last week of Jesus's life. In church we tell the story of this last week through a dramatised reading of the Gospel in which everyone takes the part of the crowd. We all shout "Hosanna to the Son of David" to welcome Jesus as he rides in to Jerusalem, and we all join in with the shout of "Crucify him!" as the crowd turn against Jesus. It never fails to be moving.

On Maundy Thursday we remember the Last Supper Jesus shared with his friends – the sharing of the bread and wine. We do this very regularly in church but it has a special potency in the context of the night when Jesus was betrayed.

It is important to share the Easter story with children – research shows that about half of children don't know the meaning of Easter. So, on Good Friday morning we do "Messy Easter" telling the Easter story with crafts, drama and song. It's always a popular and well attended event for primary aged children and parents to share. In the afternoon we gather for a quiet hour of reflection at the cross. The main event though is a wonderful Churches Together service at the cross on the summit of Eccles Pike, where we gather at 5.00 pm with Christians from Chinley, Chapel, and all the communities around the hill. There are families with children, dogs, people of all ages. It's been a local tradition for fifty years and continues, come sunshine, rain or snow! It never fails to inspire.

At Taxal our Easter morning celebration begins outside on the road. Our Easter candle is lit, and the chorus of "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" goes up to the sound of birdsong and the wind in the trees before we continue the service inside the church, which is filled with flowers and the scent of Easter lilies. Having followed the events of Holy Week through, Easter morning brings a special sense of uplift and joy.

If you have never taken part in an Easter service, you would be very welcome to dip into any of our Easter celebrations! Everyone is very welcome to join in as much or as little as you want to in an unpressured way. All the details are in the magazine and on our website.



Let's make butternut squash soup

Nothing beats a delicious hot soup on a really cold day, and this recipe is sure to become a firm favourite!

Method

- **1.** Heat the oven to 200C180C/gas 6.
- 2. Cut the squash into large cubes then toss in a large roasting tin with 1 tbsp of the olive oil.
- **3.** Roast for 30 mins until golden and soft.
- **4.** Melt the butter with remaining 1 tbsp of

olive oil in a large saucepan, then add the onion and garlic and cook until soft.

- **5.** Tip the butternut squash into the pan, add the stock and creme fraiche and whizz with a blender until smooth.
- 6. Season to taste.

RECIPE

Ingredients

- 1 butternut squash
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp butter
- 2 onions
- 1 glove garlic
- 850ml hot vegetable stock
- 4 tbsp crème fraiche

Caring for God's Acre

Taxal Churchyard is a place of soul-stirring beauty. It is a place of peace. It stretches down the hill towards the Goyt, and the dense woodland in the valley below shield both the sound and sight of traffic on Long Hill opposite. Often the only sound to be heard is the music of the river and the birdsong from the woods.

It is at its most beautiful in the late spring when it becomes a grassland strewn with native wildflowers – the kind of habitat that is increasingly rare and precious in the UK.

Like many churchyards, it is a haven for wildlife, a place for birds to nest and feed, for bees and other insects to make their homes and to support both smaller mammals and the deer which can sometimes be seen there in the evenings, when bats will flit about.

Our churchyard is consecrated ground, a sacred space belonging to St James Church which has been a place of Christian worship for nine hundred years and continues to be an active community of faith.

Our churchyard is also very much a place for



people. I find it very moving to see how well visited and tended our churchyard is. I have almost never visited without seeing someone carefully tending a grave. We want it to continue to be a place that is used, enjoyed, and respected by our local community.

Responsible

Because the churchyard is the property of the church, we at Whaley Bridge Parish are responsible for its maintenance and upkeep, which is a sizeable task! We gain some fee income at burials or when memorial stones are installed, but this does not match the expenses of maintenance. It is a challenge but we are committed to continuing to face up to it.

As an expression of this commitment we are currently opening up a new area of the churchyard for burials. The field we have been

using – to the right of the footpath as you face the river – is now full. In early 2024 we are clearing the adjacent area to the right of the current field - to make space for more burials. We are grateful to the Town Council who have offered us a grant towards the cost of this.

Over the next couple of months trees will be cut back and the ground cleared of scrub. A land drain is being installed to make it less soggy, and the path is being extended to enable access. As it is a sloping site, we need to be mindful of the safety both of coffin bearers and of relatives visiting graves. It is not possible to continue too far down the hill because the land is simply too steep to be usable safely.

Alphabetical markers designating rows will be installed to enable graves to be identified and recorded. We are currently improving and The churchyard is at its most beautiful in the late spring when it becomes a grassland strewn with native wildflowers...

updating our burial records – another large but important task. We regularly receive queries about the churchyard from people doing family history research or from families who want to reuse a grave space for a second burial.

These days most people chose cremation rather than burial and often people choose to have their ashes buried in the churchyard (Scattering of ashes inside a churchyard is not allowed). We have plenty of space for burial of ashes above the path at the top of our present field.

Yet some people continue to prefer a full burial, and I am glad that the opening up of our new field means that this option will continue to be available.

We have guidelines for looking after graves and these are available on our parish website. If you have any questions about burial in our churchyard please contact me – my details are available on page 3.

'Worship Wall' mural brings church into Kettleshulme St James school

Over one year ago we were lucky enough to secure some funding to enable us to create four murals which would help us to live out the Visions and Values of Kettleshulme St James CE Primary School on our walls for everyone to see.

The focus we wanted for the hall was a 'Worship Wall'. This is because, due to the distant location of Taxal St James Church, we rarely have the opportunity to worship in a church building so our idea was to attempt to bring the church to Kettleshulme.

The Governors and I (Mrs Bellshaw, Headteacher) worked closely with the design team from Outtareach to ensure that the final piece reflected our stunning location in the Peak District, was a true representation of Taxal St James Church, and that the visuals were surrounded by words and phrases which were used regularly within our School Family.

For this design we took inspiration from the work by Hannah Dunnett who also incorporates words into her visual art. We are very happy with the result.

As the mural is floor to ceiling it certainly has the 'wow' factor when entering into the hall. Now our daily Collective Worships are truly grounded by our visuals.

Whaley Bridge Town Council Vacancy

Whaley Bridge Town Council currently has one vacancy. The Town Council is looking to fill these vacancies and invite interested members of the public to fill in an application form to apply for co-option onto the Council.

If you are interested in becoming a Town Councillor the role will require you to attend the monthly meeting of the Town Council (apart from August). The meetings are on the second Thursday of the month, start at 7:30pm and usually last around two hours. A full calendar of meetings is available on request. One of the main duties of Councillors is to provide effective financial management of the Town Council's finances which is done through the Council meetings. The Town Council meetings also present an opportunity for Councillors to debate certain issues by requesting items are put on the agenda.

A Town Councillor plays a role in representing the community in their ward which could entail addressing grievances of residents or supporting a local community group. The Town Council has a number of advisory bodies and sub committees such as the Regeneration Committee which focuses on the Regeneration of Whaley Bridge and Furness Vale through the advisory body Whaley 4 Wards. Finally, as the Town Council is the trustee of the Mechanics Institute Charity any Town Councillor would also become a member of the trustee of the charity. If applicants would like more information about what being a trustee involves, please contact the Town Clerk.






